Weekly MessageSmith Wigglesworth: An example to us today

Smith Wigglesworth, renowned evangelist of the early 20th century, was known for his audacious faith and many miracles following his ministry. His bold declaration, "If the Holy Spirit doesn't move, I move the Spirit!" might raise eyebrows, but it offers a profound insight into his unwavering belief in God's power and his active role in partnering with the Holy Spirit.

Wigglesworth's statement wasn't an arrogant attempt to control God; rather, it reflected his deep understanding of the dynamic relationship between faith and the move of the Holy Spirit. He believed that faith isn't passive but requires action, boldness, and even a sense of holy urgency.

Throughout Scripture, we find examples of individuals who took initiative in their relationship with God:

Abraham: pleaded with God to spare Sodom and Gomorrah, ultimately negotiating a deal to save the cities if even ten righteous people could be found.

Jacob: wrestled with God all night, refusing to let go until he received a blessing.

Moses: interceded for the Israelites time and again, even daring to challenge God's plans.

While God is sovereign, He also invites us to participate in His work through prayer, faith, and action. We are not passive recipients of His blessings but active co-labourers in His kingdom.

Wigglesworth's 'secret' wasn't a formula or technique; it was an attitude of unwavering faith and a willingness to step out in boldness, even when it seemed unconventional. He believed that God's power was available to those who dared to ask, seek, and knock. He didn't passively wait around for the Holy Spirit to

move, but actively sought the Spirit, wanting Him to flow freely. Wigglesworth preached with passion, prayed with fervency, and laid hands on the sick with unwavering faith. He refused to be limited by his circumstances or the doubts or criticisms of others.

So, are we passive observers, waiting for God to do everything, or are we actively partnering with Him to see His kingdom come on earth?

Boldness: Don't be afraid to ask big things of God. He is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine (Ephesians 3:20). Persistence: Don't give up when you don't see immediate results. Keep praying, keep believing, and keep knocking until the door opens.

Faith-fuelled Action: Don't just talk about faith; act on it. Step out in boldness, even when it feels uncomfortable or uncertain. Partnership: Recognise that the Holy Spirit is your helper and guide. Seek His guidance and be willing to follow His leading.

"If the Holy Spirit doesn't move, I move the Spirit!" may sound unorthodox, but it reveals a profound truth about the power of faith and the importance of active participation in God's work. Let us dare to believe that we, too, can move in God's mighty power. Let us not be afraid to ask, seek, and knock, knowing that our Heavenly Father is eager to pour out His blessings on those who come to Him in faith.
