# Weekly Message

#### **God's Generous Provision**

A couple of weeks ago we celebrated Harvest Festival, one of the traditions of the Church which dates back to the Jewish festivals of the Old Testament, and when we give thanks to God for providing for our physical needs. We recall God's promise to Noah: While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease (Genesis 8:22).

Of course, for many of us harvest does not have the same significance that it might have had for largely agricultural communities who were reliant on the annual gathering of the crops at the end of summer, whose yield would determine their income for the year ahead. Sometimes we can even forget when produce is in season – not so long ago strawberries could only be seen in the shops for a few weeks in early summer, rather than all year round as we now find. There is, however, a responsibility to consider what we are buying, where it has come from and how it got to us, and to consider the environmental impact of choosing food which is flown from far away.

Whether we are directly involved in agriculture or simply consumers, we should not forget God's generous provision for all of us. Food shortages are almost unheard of in the UK, which can risk us taking it for granted, but we should not.

We should also remember that many people are struggling to feed themselves at this time. We donated the gifts of food which were brought to the harvest display to the Horsham Foodbank, which is run by Horsham Matters, a Christian charity set up by Horsham Churches Together. The foodbank has been running for 10 years and currently provides 800 individual parcels of food each month to needy people – an initiative which demonstrates how the local churches can make a real difference in our community.

Back in July we held our first Thanksgiving Day, when members of the BRBC community were invited to make financial gifts to support

several external organisations, and over £8,000 was raised. The church already gives 10% of its regular income to selected causes, and in total during the last financial year we were able to give more than £33,000 to support organisations including BMS World Mission, the Home Mission Fund, Tearfund, SAT-7, Wycliffe Bible Translators, Bible Society, The Leprosy Mission, Horsham Debt Advice Centre, and Oasis Pregnancy Crisis Centre.

These organisations are all involved in furthering God's work in different ways, in the UK and many parts of the world. It is a real privilege that we are able, out of God's generous provision to us, to support these activities. I thank God that we are able to share His generosity and pray that we may never forget to do so.
