# **Weekly Message**

# **Praying Dangerous Prayers**

With Israel and Iran in the news headlines of our precarious world today, I find myself reminded of a favourite Bible character of mine – Nehemiah - a servant of King Artaxerxes I of Persia (modern-day Iran).

As the king's cupbearer, Nehemiah held a position of trust and esteem, enjoying privileged proximity to the monarch. However, such closeness carried lethal risk, for one day, the king noticed a sombreness in his cupbearer's countenance and inquired about his well-being. Aware that manifesting melancholy before his majesty, could prove fatal, Nehemiah embraced the danger, prayed to the God of heaven and shared his heart.

## Praying boldly from the heart

This is a pivotal moment in Nehemiah's life where he, after significant time praying and fasting, by faith, presented the sacred vessel of the cup of his heart before the king. The king recognised the manifest "sadness of heart" and, because the gracious hand of Nehemiah's God was with him, the king granted his carefully and prayerfully thought-through request to rebuild ruined Jerusalem.

We, too, are granted the opportunity to come close to the King, standing before our Sovereign God, bearing our heart-desires for the broken world around us – assured of His gracious welcome through the cross of Christ.

## Praying beyond personal ambition

Nehemiah's prayer was not motivated by self-interest or personal gain. Despite his esteemed position, he sought not to elevate his own status but aimed at the far higher calling of restoration and renewal. Dangerous prayers transcend personal ambitions and embrace the loftier and courageous callings of the kingdom.

Jesus said: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me." (Luke 9:23) And the Apostle Paul wrote, "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others." (Philippians 2:2-4)

# Praying whilst embracing responsibility

Nehemiah's prayers were not merely pleas for divine or kingly intervention, for he was willing to assume responsibility for God's purposes and call upon him. Dangerous prayers are not passive requests for change but active commitments to serve. Nehemiah was ready to step into a role that demanded personal service, sacrifice and selflessness. Jesus said: "Anyone who wants to be first must be the very last, and the servant of all." (Mark 9:35)

# Are your prayers dangerous?

In our day, as we face challenges and changes near and far, let us set our sights beyond any brokenness and ruin or uncertainty and disgrace. Through prayer and fasting, may we boldly approach the King, with the unconcealed cup of our heart held out to him – requesting repair in the place of despair – prepared to lay our lives down before Him and one another in sacrificial service.
