Weekly Message The year of the Lord's welcome

When Jesus first preached in Nazareth, he quoted <u>Isaiah 61:1</u> and said that the prophecy about being anointed with the Spirit to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour had been fulfilled in the hearing of the congregation (<u>Luke 4:14-30</u>). They were amazed that the lad they had seen growing up could now speak with such grace. They had heard that Jesus had done amazing things down the road at Capernaum, and now it was their turn. But Jesus pushes back against such expectations, warning that prophets are not made welcome in their hometown. He suggests that the year of the Lord's favour is not primarily for them – first and foremost it is for others, for Gentiles, for outsiders. The mood in the synagogue turns ugly, and Jesus barely escapes with his life. Grace is for sharing, not hoarding. God's favour is renewed when we share it with others; if we try and keep it for ourselves, then it is corrupted and distorted by our selfishness.

I'm reflecting on Joshua Jipp's book, Saved by Grace and Hospitality. He suggests that the phrase 'the year of the Lord's favour' could be translated as 'the year of the Lord's welcome'. He suggests that the grace of God towards sinful outsiders was expressed in Jesus sharing meals with them (<u>Luke 15:1-2</u>). Grace starts with a welcome. Jesus welcomed a crowd of 5000, not only teaching them and healing them, but also finding a way to feed them at the end of the day (<u>Luke 9:10-17</u>).

Zacchaeus just wanted to see Jesus as he went by, but Jesus invited himself round, and again people were unhappy that Jesus disregarded social barriers to welcome people into the kingdom. It was because Zacchaeus opened his home that Jesus could say, 'Salvation has come to this house today' (<u>Luke 19:1-10</u>). Here we see the outworking of Jesus' words in <u>Luke 9:48</u> as he talks about what it means to be welcomed by those who are of no account:

'Whoever welcomes this little child in my name welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me.'

If we were to take Jesus seriously, does that mean that we should welcome anyone and everyone into God's family as if we were welcoming Jesus himself? If so, then whoever we meet, we can pray that Christ would be part of that encounter. One of our aspirations as a church is to be a safe place where Jesus meets us at our point of need and empowers us to walk in newness of life, and He wants to do that in and through every conversation that we have.

Jesus' words invite us to reflect on the breadth and the depth of our welcome. Do we draw distinctions about who we are prepared to welcome into God's family? How deep is our welcome? Do we invite people in, or do we chat to them on the doorstep? Will 2025 be the year of the Lord's welcome at Brighton Road?
