

Weekly Message Believer's Baptism - Unity in Community

Today, I have the joy and honour of baptising our youngest child. Gathering as church, in worship and fellowship, we reflect on the profound truths of our faith, and today, especially, the significance of believer's baptism. What some may perceive as a religious ritual, this sacred act of obedience is a powerful expression of our identity and unity in Christ as members of His one body of believers.

In <u>Galatians 3:26-28</u>, the Apostle Paul writes, "So in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith. For all of you who were baptised into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." Baptism marks the moment when we publicly identify with Jesus, as His disciples. We signify we are no longer slaves to sin, but children of God, freed through faith in Christ. We are clothed with Christ, adorned with His righteousness and grace.

Having in mind Tim's bulletin message last week about Unity of the Spirit, I recall <u>Ephesians 4:4-6</u>: "There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all." Paul reminds us of the singular purpose that binds all believers - our one shared faith in Lord Jesus.

Baptism transcends all human divisions. In Christ, there is no distinction of ethnicity, social status, or gender – His gospel breaks down barriers that might divide us. Regardless of background or differences, through baptism, we are united in one Saviour and one faith. Baptism points to becoming part of a greater family, a community where unity in Christ is central.

It reminds us that every believer, regardless of earthly identity, shares a heavenly identity in Jesus.

"One Lord, one faith, one baptism" – Baptism is not just a personal proclamation; it is a communal affirmation of our unity in Christ - we declare our belonging to Christ's one body, the Church. We are not isolated individuals but are interconnected, bound by the Spirit of God, with Christ as Head (Ephesians 4:15-16, 5:23, Colossians 1:18). Baptism is not just a memory of a moment; it is a continual reminder that we are part of the larger body of Christ. It calls us to live out our faith in a way that reflects the unity and love we share in Him, despite diversity or difference.

A believer's baptism is not only an individual obedience and expression of an inward reality, it is a declaration of Church Community Unity in Christ. When a believer is baptised, we are all pointed to the grace, faith and unity we share together. It is a plea for all of us to live as "one in heart and mind" (Acts 4:32) - supporting and encouraging one another in whatever challenges we face.
