Weekly Message

From the Crib to the Cross

At this time of year, the Christmas story will be told and retold countless times in different places, in different ways and to different audiences. Thousands, if not millions, of people in our country alone will 'read', hear or take part in the birth story of Jesus, known as the Nativity. It is a good story much celebrated and enjoyed. Sadly, when the Christmas season has ended, so the story for some also ends. The book is closed. Their interest in Jesus does not extend beyond him lying in his crib.

The angel's message to the shepherds tells us why we should read on, not close the book, but finish the story. Let us remind ourselves of the message. The angel said 'I am here with good news for you....this very day your Saviour is born- Christ the Lord'. This part of the story may be well known to you but please do not close the book. To leave the story there is to miss out, not just on a good story, but also on the 'good news' which is 'for you'. The good news is that in the birth of Jesus God has come to us in human flesh. Read on from the birth story and you will encounter a Jesus who is both man and God. Read about his life and teachings. Journey with Him as he travels from the crib to the cross. Pause here and take time to kneel at the foot of the crucified Jesus and you will experience God's perfect Love poured out for you, a Peace which comes from sins forgiven, Joy as you give your life to Him and Hope as you receive God's gift of eternal life. (John 3 vs 16) Surely this life changing story is worth finishing!

Take a look at the picture chosen for the front of our bulletin this week. Can you see the crib and the cross? Where are you? At the crib or the cross? If you are still at the crib I would encourage you to read on and start the journey. If you are between the two then please press on towards the cross and your Saviour. And if you are at the cross and have found the Saviour then praise God and share him with others!
