Weekly Message Thoughts on our place in the Universe

I have watched David Attenborough's Blue Planet series, and recently Prof. Brian Cox's programme on our solar system. Then, mention of the wise men's star and our Housegroup study of Paul's letter to the Roman church chapter 1 got me thinking and reading library books about our place amongst God's creation of this Universe.

In Horsham, we seldom see more than a few stars and planets in our night sky because of air and light pollution – though we do have a designated 'Dark Sky' area in the South Downs National Park.

The ancients of Abraham's time (approx 1900BC) on a clear night would have seen, from horizon to horizon, the myriad of stars slowly wheeling around their night sky. So when God made his covenant with Abraham in Genesis Ch15 vs4-5 He said "Look toward heaven, and number the stars, if you are able to number them" and "So shall your offspring be." For a childless man, that would have been mind-blowing, as there were countless thousands of stars.

David, too, when a shepherd sitting on a hilltop (approx. 1020BC), would have seen this ceiling of stars, and felt his smallness; and yet he knew his significance in his Creator's eyes. He expresses this beautifully in Psalm 19 v1-6:-

"The heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky above proclaims his handiwork.

Day to day pours out speech, and night to night reveals knowledge."

From the first Christmas time we remember the visit of the wise men to Jesus' family, led by following a 'star'. Royal Museums, Greenwich, give 5 possible explanations:- a Nova or Supernova explosion, a comet, a conjunction of Jupiter and Saturn, a stationary point of Jupiter, or a conjunction of Jupiter, Regulus and Venus. But perhaps, like the angels appearing to the shepherds with the good news of Christ's birth, the 'star' was another heavenly appearance. Wise men sought Jesus then, and they still do!

In Paul's letter to the Roman church, he explains how all people can know

their creator God through knowing the created world in which we live. In the 1st Chapter vs19-20, Paul writes, "They know everything that can be known about God, because God has shown it all to them. God's eternal power and character cannot be seen. But from the beginning of creation, God has shown what these are like by all he has made." That's true for us, too, of course.

Now with the latest James Webb Infra-red Telescope, we look deeper into space. The Universe we see becomes bigger still, so we can feel still smaller and more insignificant.

In Psalm 8 vs 3-6 David first felt his insignificance in creation, but then he acknowledged the value that God gives to mankind and mankind's responsibility for God's creation:-

"When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, what is man that you are mindful of him, and the son of man that you care for him? Yet you have made him a little lower than the heavenly beings and crowned him with glory and honour."

Each Christmas reminds us how much God continually values and loves us, however small we might feel. He doesn't abandon his creation; rather he demonstrated his loving commitment to us, that while we were still sinners (disobedient, wilful, mis-users of his created world), his son Jesus Christ was born, lived and died for us. So we can sing the hymn:-

O Lord my God! When I in awesome wonder, Consider all the works thy hand hath made, I see the stars, I hear the mighty thunder, Thy power throughout the universe displayed: Then sings my soul, my Saviour God, to thee, How great thou art! How great thou art!

So look up and out and wonder. Enjoy this world God has given us to care for; and worship our Creator who knows us and loves us.
