Weekly Message

Just waiting for you!

In this interregnum period we are being asked to offer help to the very stretched leadership team and the many hardworking backroom people. We may wonder what we can offer; what gifts have we that can be put to use?

I am put to mind the old children's song 'There's a work for Jesus none but you can do'. Incidentally, it is the all-time favourite of the church in Ghana! Give yourself a treat and listen to the Musikeers Ensemble Ghana singing 'Yesu Wo Adwuma'.

I think that the key in the song is that the work is for Jesus. It is He that gives the call and also He that enables. Pauline and I have found this to be true throughout our Christian lives from our teens to now in our 80's. Today is celebrated as World Leprosy Day. It has been our privilege and challenge to be volunteers for the mission over the last 15 years. We had no gifts or skills for the demands that involved acquiring medical knowledge, I.T. skills, filming, fund raising or encouraging those suffering from the most disfiguring of diseases. It was our love of mountain walking which started us on a 9-day Himalayan trek which led to a 15-year journey of seeing how God equipped us to fulfil His calling.

Perhaps it is a pattern that God might use to call you to the work that 'none but you can do'. He can start with calling you to engage within your comfort zone and then step by step enable you to know the thrill of leaving that comfort zone to do the work that He has especially for you. We have the assurance that it in His power we are able to carry out His calling.

In Ephesians 4 vs 11-12 Paul tells us that the God given leadership of the church is for the purpose of equipping us for works of service so that the body of Christ may be built up. The body of Christ includes BRBC as well as the worldwide church. It is the church that God is using to transform individuals, communities and nations. What a privilege to be part of it.
